Vigil Dominates DBx Smack Down! Fryer, Irons and Rold Score Big Wins!

After a prolonged year of lamentation and self-examination, the Colorado Military Historians at long last got the opportunity to avenge last years' DBx Smack Down defeat at the hands of the Colorado Springs Gamers Association. The setting was High Noon on 28 July at CollectorMania, a splendid and well-appointed gaming and comics shop in Parker, Colorado. The ancient and medieval armies poured out onto their respective battlefields in grim array. Stroke and counter-stroke struggled fiercely amidst the din. When the dust had settled and results were in, the Chroniclers recounted that:

In DBA 2.2 Book I Competition, Roy Hayes of CSGA with New Kingdom Egyptians smote Terry Shockey of CMH with Mycenaeans 43 to 16.

In DBA 2.2 Book II Competition, Larry Irons of CMH with Tamils smote Bernie Santucci of CSGA with Graecho-Bactrians 35 to 5.

In DBA 2.2 Book III Competition, Matt Vigil of CMH with East Franks smote Doug Mudd of CSGA with Nikephorian Byzantines 39 to 1.

In DBA 2.2 Book IV Competition, Rob Scholtz of CSGA with Teutonic Knights smote Jim Rairdon of CMH with Imperial Germans 36 to 4.

In HOTT Competition, Greg Rold of CMH with Orcs and Elves smote Doug Rains of CSGA with Trolls and Men 31 to 9.

In DBM 3.1 Competition, Dick Fikes of CSGA with Desert Blemmye smote Pat Harvey of CMH with Late Imperial Romans 35 to 15.

In BBDBA 2.2 Competition, Tony Fryer and John Brown of CMH with Late Imperial Romans and Desert Nomads smote Art Hayes of CSGA with Late Imperial Romans and Alans 48 to 2.

Overall team scores totaled 178 for CMH (winning 4 events) and 130 for CSGA (winning 3 events). At long last hard-fought victory gave CMH the vengeance it so richly deserved! The barbarians from south of Castle Rock had been turned back at the very gates of Civilization! As a parting shot, a devastated but still defiant Rob Scholtz vowed CSGA would extract vengeance of its own next year. CMH's unintimidated response is *Adduct eam!* This roughly translates to "Bring it on!"

With respect to individual awards, Art Hayes of CSGA won the much-feared Pink Dice Award – his luck wasn't just bad, it was spectacularly bad! He did have competition for the Pink Dice from Greg Rold and Pat Harvey, but in a roll-off rolled a 1 to their 5's – it figures! Roy Hayes of CSGA had the lead for ancients and Matt Vigil of CMH the lead for medievals, winning an appropriate DVD each. Dick Fikes' win in DBM 3.1 won him a copy of the rules for DBMM2 – the next step up in war-gaming complexity. Greg Rold, amidst disparaging banter, won the DVD *Princess Bride* for his HOTT performance. Matt Vigil was applauded as the most valuable player. Not only did he score highest, he did so while standing in for Doug Wildfong with three minutes notice. Doug had to go the hospital unexpectedly. Fortunately his condition proved not to be serious, and he was able to rejoin us before the Smack Down was over.

Kudos go to the barbarous Doug Rains for organizing the CSGA half of the event, to Chris and Eric of CollectorMania and their parents for having been such gracious hosts, and to Jim Rairdon for having served so ably as Quartermaster General for the Smack Down. Jim provided superlative homemade sausage with appropriate Teutonic fixings while coordinating the further donations of German rye bread by Larry Irons, German potato salad by John Brown (actually Mary Beth) and delectable cookies by Terry Shockey (actually Anita). The German theme fit in with the number of Teutonic armies in play!

The next big DBx event is to be the DBA 3.0 Tournament at Tacticon on 2 September. Play will run from 0900 to 1600. As this is to be the maiden voyage of the new and exciting DBA 3.0 rules in Denver, we will begin with a tutorial discussing changes in the rules between DBA 2.2 and DBA 3.0. Don't miss it! Colorado Military Historians (CMH) is a non-profit organization whose purpose is to promote historical wargaming and the study of military history. Founded in 1965, CMH meets monthly on the second Sunday of the month, except in May when the meeting is deferred to the third Sunday. The meeting starts at noon at the Baker Recreation Center, 6751 Irving Street (just a few blocks west of Federal Blvd), Denver, Colorado. The club also hosts gaming at least one Friday night a month, called "Friday Night Fights" (FNF) at 7:00 p.m. One Friday of the month will be held at the Baker Community Center. The other Friday meetings will be held at a future determined location. See website for latest information.

CMH maintains ties with numerous local, regional and national groups to help promote the hobby. CMH is governed by member-elected officers serving on the Board of Directors (executive board). Terms of office are one year, with elections held at the May meeting. New members are accepted after attending three CMH functions and a vote of the membership. Dues are \$35.00 per year, payable in January. Members wishing to receive a snail-mailed newsletter subscription must pay an additional fee of \$15.00 per year. Authors retain ownership of articles and graphics published. CMH reserves the right to edit or reject submissions to the newsletter.
