Jeff Lambert's September Report on the WWI Aerial Combat Campaign

The great offensive by the Germans to end the war, known as the Ludendorff Offensive, has ended in failure. Now, the Allies go on their own all-out offensive along the whole front, with British, French, Americans and even Portuguese troops attacking German positions known as the Hindenburg Line. Italy and Austria continue their war in the Alps, with fortune swinging at last in the Italians' favor. Allied optimism is increasing, while the German general staff is divided on how to continue, with some urging an armistice while others demand a fight to the end. Only in the air war are the Germans showing any strength, as new designs help to mitigate the superior Allied numbers.

Lt. Manley led a *staffel* of inexperienced pilots on a trench-strafing raid over the British lines. Flying a Fokker DVIIf, he was joined by Lt. Marston and Lt. Johnson in Fokker DVII's as well. Lt. Chase and Lt. Lythgoe added to the German strength flying in



Siemens-Schuckert D.IV's, a renewed design just added to the arsenal. As they dove on the British lines, the RAF arrived in the person of Lt. Lambert (Sopwith Camel) Lt. Wharrier (Camel) and Lt. Forte in the new Sopwith Snipe. They were reinforced by two pilots from another squadron, Lt. Irons and Lt. Hunt flying SE5a's.

The Germans coolly ignored the British fighters and flew low across the trenchlines, pouring Spandau fire on the hapless Tommies below. The return fire from the ground caused little damage, but the Germans were finally forced to respond when the British pilots started to score hits. Forte's Snipe drew up on Chase's SSW and shot him down, while Marston saw the odds turning against him with critically low ammunition and dangerous damage to his Fokker. Marston escaped, pursued by Lambert but able to shake off the Camel and return to German lines. Hunt pursued another Siemens, but got disoriented and lost from the combat.

Manley continued to dogfight with the British while Lythgoe and Johnson kept up their ground attacks. A Fokker "razor", the new monoplane design, arrived late to the battle and traded shots with Wharrier. Eventually, Wharrier's Camel was too shot up to continue, and Wharrier took to his parachute, a recent option for British pilots. As happens too often, it failed to function properly and Wharrier was killed. The "Razor" was badly damaged in the exchange, however, and made a forced landing. Avoiding the trenches and shellholes, the pilot miraculously escaped the crippled plane, burned it, and slipped past the Tommies who were keeping their heads down from the strafing Germans.

Having disrupted the British infantry in the sector, running low on ammunition and fuel, and losing two aircraft in the attack, Manley decided to take his victory and return home. Signaling his pilots, they all broke off successfully. With Wharrier KIA and Hunt missing, the British were too exhausted from the fight to pursue.
