




News and Views

Action at Arracourt

Battle Report by CMH Member Doug Wildfong

Dave and Geoff played an Arc of Fire game today based loosely on the action around Arracourt in September of 1944. The 4th Armored CCA was attacked by the German 113th Pz Brigade.

Today we had a section of Panther (two tanks), with three squads of Germans, (One squad and the HQ section in Halftracks) against a section of M-10s (two TD's), some engineers, and some armored infantry.

Turn 1: Two dismounted Germans squads march on the table, using the woods for cover. (Lower right of Photo) (AoF game mechanics allow troops on foot a move of 4 inches or 6 inches (a run) if motivated by enemy fire or passing a "Tac Test".



The Armored section and the Halftrack mounted Panzer Grenadiers entered on the road.

Turn 2: The German Panthers, 3rd squad in a halftrack, and the HQ section come on. The Panthers Larry Armin painted look great if imposing!



Turn 3: The M-10s opened up, killing the lead Panther, and neutralizing the rear Panther. Things look good. The German armor TAC is a 7, as the 113th was a green unit. (One of the M-10's can be seen at the top of the photo hidden in some woods to the right of the road from the German perspective. "Neutralizing" is another game mechanic representing a tracked or wheeled vehicle being suppressed and unable to move or fire until it recovers by a successful "Tac Test")



Turn 4: Disaster! The German infantry has somehow snuck around the American infantry on lookout and is assaulting one of the M-10s'. The rear Panther rolls to get rid of the neutralization, (rolls a 7 or

more on a D-10) and immobilizes the other M-10. The crew of the immobilized M-10 bails out and runs away. Suddenly the US boys have no anti-armor.



Turns 5-8: The German infantry advances on the last two houses, while the Panther shoots from a distance. The Americans bring the Engineers out of the furthest house but are cut down by the advancing Germans squad that got the M-10. Boy the lookouts for the US infantry really let the team down.



All in all, it was a fun game. We think we have a good way to make it work for two players on each side when we are finally able to get back together.
