

### **Bolt Action: Third Edition changes**

- Shape Charged Weapons (Bazookas, Piats, Panzerfaust) now have a 2" template. So now you can take out MMGs and snipers hiding in buildings Panzerfaust now cost 15 points. Totally agree 5 points was too cheap to kill a 250 tank.
- LMGs are 15 Platoon leaders are as cheap as 20 & 30 points. The main reason is for every section you add to your platoon has to have PL. Being that platoons look like companies; you might want to take a Company Commander and their only 50 points. I never took them unless it was for a historical battle, but I will for 50.
- US forces don't have combat maneuvers rule (the rule where they did add a movement penalty +1 when they shoot). Now for every 3 soldiers, you get 1 extra dice added for shooting. You have 9-man squad, you add 3 more dice to shooting
- If you kill the sniper (the one with the rifle) the observer next to him immediately becomes the sniper (which should have been the rule anyhow)
- Shooting: To hit is on a 4 or better. Here are the only modifiers added to shooting:
  - o Firer is moving -1
  - o Pinned -1
  - o Inexperienced-1
  - o And the new change: Point Blank -2
- No more figuring out terrain modifiers to your shooting. After you determine how many hits you made, you pick up the dice that hit, roll them for saves.
- Soft cover 5 or better, Hard cover 4 or better, and Down 5 (if you have no cover) or +2 modifier if their in cover. For example, unit is in soft cover that's a 5 to save, but is also down so you add the +2 modifier (combining the saves) and now a 3 or better saves.
- Fubar you now shoot at Friendly units on 1-3 when you roll D6.
- Tanks are a lot cheaper, so you can field more.
- Run off the table in Fubar when they panic
- 1 Roll for Rally
- No wound on 6 (no picking NCO)
- Max morale 11 and minimum is always 2.
- If you stay down and retain dice, in the next turn you lose all your pins
- You can move through friendly units, but you must move 1 inch away from all units
- Crew for squad weapons must be within 1 inch of the weapon, or suffer -1
- Platoon Commander cannot snap too if down
- Medics don't count to victory points, no weapon but will fight in close assault
- FAO cost less, can be used for spotter for indirect fire
- Bike rule
- Cavalry add +1 to save roll
- All cavalry can charge and be tough fighters
- Fanatics take morale check without pins as long as there is two men. Close Assault same rules, fight to wiped out or 1 man
- Green units only become regulars on a 6
- Snipers get +1 to hit modifier and +1 damage
- Sniper gets killed, spotter becomes sniper but -1 for no loader and -1 no leader
- Flamethrower

# **Historic Location of the Month** *Fort Hamilton, NY*

I believe the postcard below is either Doubleday or Brown battery (showing a 12" disappearing gun) at Fort Hamilton, NY (blue marker on map). The island fort in the background is Fort Lafayette (1822-1946). Fort Lafayette was demolished in 1960 to make way for the Verrazzano-Narrows Bridge. Fort Hamilton is the only active DoD military post in New York City.
